1. Upper Division General Education Requirements:

Option A. Approved Disciplinary Minor of second degree or second major

Option B. Interdisciplinary Minor (specifically 12 hours, 3 hours can be in the major)

Option C. International Business and Regional courses or an approved Certification Program such as teaching licensure.

Option D. Two Upper-Division courses from outside the College of Business and not required by the major (6 hours)

2. In addition to being admitted to the University, students must also apply and be accepted to the College of Business and Public Administration. Admission to all of the BSBA degree programs is a two-step process. Details on this application process can be found at:

3. Students who have earned Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Arts and Sciences degrees from the Virginia Community College System institutions or Richard Bland College will have met all lower-level general education requirements. However, they must still meet specific departmental requirements indicated on the curriculum sheet. Students who have already completed a bachelor's degree are exempt from lower and upper division general education requirements, to include the LANGUAGE AND CULTURE requirement. If the general education requirements aren't met by one of the above options, the general education requirement for LANGUAGE AND CULTURE can be met or waived for students who:

- Completed high school before December 31, 1985.
- Completed the third level of one foreign language in high school.
- Completed the second level of each of two foreign languages in high school (including American Sign Language).
- Earned a university-parallel associates degree approved to meet all lower division general education requirements.
- Earned a bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution prior to admission to ODU as a second degree student.
- Have a native language other than English.

If the requirement is not met by one of the above means, students must successfully complete the 101F and 102F level of an approved foreign language sequence, including American Sign Language.

Effective Fall 2010, only the Associate in General Studies degrees offered by the VCCS institutions that have been recognized as transfer degrees by the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV) will be accepted as meeting lower-level general education requirements.
