TRANSFER AGREEMENT WITH GUARANTEED ADMISSION BETWEEN OLD DOMINION UNIVERSITY AND STUDENTS AT SELECTED COMMUNITY COLLEGES¹

Old Dominion University (ODU) recognizes the need for and importance of facilitating the transfer of students from one institution to the other as they pursue their educational goals. Per this agreement, ODU provides students from selected community colleges an opportunity for guaranteed admission to the university. Students who do not meet the requirements described herein are encouraged to apply and may be considered for admission under the regular admission procedures of the University.

Section 1: Definition of Guaranteed Admission Agreement (GAA)

An agreement between students from select community colleges and ODU to which a student is guaranteed admission to ODU by earning a transfer degree satisfying specified academic benchmarks and criteria. Students transferring under a general admission GAA are not necessarily entitled to be admitted to a specific program.

Section 2: Requirements for Admission

A. Applicable Associate Degrees: This agreement applies to all approved transfer degrees as referenced in Appendix A and determined to be university-parallel transfer degrees.

B. Minimum GPA requirement:

A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 for credits earned at the degree-granting institution is required. ODU will recognize the cumulative GPA as recorded on the community college transcript and not recalculate based on multiple course attempts. Courses transferred into the two-year college are not included in the GPA computation.

C. Limitations due to academic or disciplinary record:

ODU reserves the right to deny admission or enrollment to students who have been academically dismissed or suspended or to those convicted of a felony. Disciplinary records are considered in determining eligibility for admission and enrollment.

D. Course requirements:

In order for credits to transfer to ODU, students are required to earn a grade of "C" or better in each community college course applicable to the transfer degree from the community college. ODU recommends students consult ODU's program guides for course recommendations for specific ODU majors (<u>Curriculum Sheets</u> | Old Dominion University).

E. Minimum credits to be completed at associate degree institution:

Students must meet all requirements to earn an associate degree as determined by their community college, including a minimum of 60 credit; a minimum of 30 credits must be completed at the degree-granting institution.

F. Maximum credits applicable for transfer:

A maximum of 90 transfer credits will apply towards the bachelor's degree requirements.

G. Testing requirements:

No test scores are required.

H. Admission application and enrollment:

ODU recommends, but does not require, students complete the standard Transfer Application by the priority deadlines for fall, spring, and summer semesters established on the ODU Office of Admissions website in order to ensure timely application review and academic advising for ODU classes. If needed, students admitted through the GAA may request a one-year extension for their enrollment.

I. Transcript submission:

Students are required to provide an official transcript. Students must submit an official transcript including all final grades and documentation of the conferred associate degree within one month of enrollment at ODU.

J. Registration of Intent to use the agreement:

ODU recommends, but does not require, students register their intent to use this agreement after completion of 15 college credits through the ODU transfer website (<u>https://www.odu.edu/transfer/letter-of-intent</u>). By registering their intent to enroll at ODU, students will receive admission information and transfer support from ODU prior to their application.

Section 3: Application of Associate Degree to General Education Requirement

Completion of an approved transfer associate degree satisfies automatically all lower- division General Education requirements at ODU upon admission to ODU, regardless of eligibility for guaranteed admission or time of entry following completion of an approved transferrable degree.

Section 4: Application of this Agreement to Students Earning Associate Degree Concurrent with High School

No distinction will be made by ODU regarding college courses applicable to the transfer-oriented associate degree that are taken through dual enrollment arrangements with high schools. Completion of the transfer-oriented associate degree while enrolled in high school will not exclude the student from eligibility under this agreement. High school students who earn an associate degree concurrent with graduation from high school must follow the freshman application and indicate they are applying as a freshman when prompted on the admission application, but make sure to mention the completion of the associate degree.

Section 5: Applications of this Agreement to Students Earning Credit for Prior Learning

Credit awarded at a previous institution for AP, CLEP, IB and Cambridge International examination scores will be reevaluated by ODU. Credit is not guaranteed for these courses; credit will be granted only if AP, CLEP, IB, and Cambridge International examination scores meet established ODU criteria found on the ODU website (<u>https://www.odu.edu/academics/academic-records/score-analysis/ap-ib</u>). For these credits to be accepted by ODU, GAA students are responsible for submitting the necessary official documentation to ODU's Admissions office.

Section 6: Completion Criteria and Catalog Determination

GAA students will be required to meet graduation requirements as stated in the ODU Undergraduate Catalog in effect at the date of submission of the Letter of Intent to Transfer to ODU (unless changes to the curriculum are required to meet state and/or national accreditation guidelines). Consistent with requirements for native students, GAA students who do not complete the bachelor's degree within six years of the date of submission of the electronic Letter of Intent to Transfer must choose to graduate under the requirements listed in any subsequent ODU Undergraduate Catalog in effect within the six-year period preceding the date of graduation from ODU.

Students must enroll at the four-year institution within one year of completing their associate degree.

Section 7: Program Guide – Student Document

The Program Guides represent all requirements for admittance under this GAA and the benefits that result. Please visit the ODU Program Guides website for additional information: Curriculum Sheets Old Dominion University.

Section 8: Administration of Agreement

The ODU official responsible for all ODU aspects of the GAA and Letter of Intent to Transfer is the Vice President for Student Engagement and Enrollment Services or his/her designee. The ODU official responsible for the approval of these agreements is the Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs or his/her designee.

This agreement will remain in effect until modified or terminated. Students who register their intent to use this agreement under the GAA prior to the date of termination are eligible for admission for two years after termination becomes effective.

The effective date of this Agreement is the date last signed by the Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs or his/her designee. The signed Agreement will be maintained on ODU's website.
